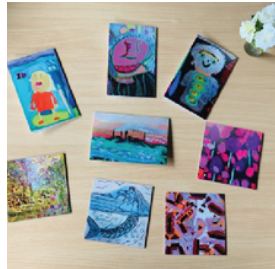


Great chase community event 2023

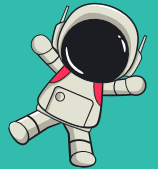
Singer profile review

Chocolate spiders

What you need

- 1 packet Changi's original fried noodles
